Job Summary:

A Behavior Technician works one on one with individuals who need a high level of support to achieve academic, behavior and social goals, to allow them the provisions they need to become as successful and independent as possible. This job requires a high amount of training on skill development, data collection, provision of academic support, etc. It is highly rewarding, however stressful, and requires a person who is open to new ideas and loves a team approach when tackling difficulties.

Job Duties and Responsibilities:

Duties and responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- The Behavior Technician is under direct supervision of the Special Education Teacher, Behavior Analyst (Board Certified Behavior Analyst {BCBA}, Assistant Behavior Analyst {BCaBA}, Licensed Behavior Analyst {LBA}) and the Lead Behavior Technician;
- Report any concerns directly to the Lead Behavior Technicians, then to Behavior Analysts as necessary;
- Provide teaching trials, lesson plans, tasks, teaching procedures, etc., record data on student responses, and reinforce correct work according to the established program, as directed by the LBA;
- Work with students throughout the day on communication skills, social skills, behavioral skills, sensory issues and other individually designed activities such as self-help skills, as directed by the LBA;
- Record beginning and completion dates of activities on program sheets;
- Develop program materials;
- Participate in team meetings on a regular basis;
- Maintains student program books on a weekly basis, as directed by the LBA;
- Make sure all rooms are cleaned, trash is empty, doors shut and lights off daily at the end of the day; and
- Write progress notes.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree (or actively pursuing a degree);
- Demonstrates professionalism at all times, including adherence to the standards of **professional conduct**;
- Is dependable, energetic and relates well to children;
- Demonstrates ability to prioritize and carry out work-related tasks appropriately;
- Demonstrate an ability to understand and carry out a systematic instructional sequence;
- Low rate of absenteeism and prompt attendance to work;
- Ability to communicate appropriately;
- Demonstrate organizational, interpersonal and multitasking skills; and,
- After probationary period, Behavior Technicians should be demonstrating willingness and competency to become a Registered Behavior Technician*.

*A Behavior Technician qualifies for a Registered Behavior Technician once he/she has completed a 40 hour training sequence and interview assessment with a Behavior Analyst. An application and fee must be submitted to the BACB.

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
